Supv. Tim Maass was contacted by Northeast Roofing to discuss cost effective options. Troy Eick from Northeast Roofing discussed with the Town Board the different types of insulation that could reduce the cost of a new roof for the Town Hall. To hold the current contract pricing, it was decided to award the contract with Northeast Roofing and discuss possible change orders with them moving forward.
